Community Health Worker Home Visits for Medicaid-Enrolled Children With Asthma: Effects on Asthma Outcomes and Costs

Researchers found that a streamlined CHW asthma home visit program for children with uncontrolled asthma improved health outcomes and yielded a return on investment of 1.90. <http://ajph.aphapublications.org/doi/pdf/10.2105/AJPH.2015.302685>

Prenatal C-reactive Protein Levels Indicative of Early-onset Asthma

Systemic inflammation in at-risk mothers during pregnancy may be indicative of a prenatal environment that could increase a child's risk for asthma and wheezing early in life, according to study results.

Researchers assessed patients with COPD to determine if the use of usual clinical features for the diagnosis of asthma and COPD could identify asthma-COPD overlap syndrome (ACOS), and found a stepwise approach

Th2 Biomarkers Help Identify Inflammation in Patients with Asthma

Th2 biomarker levels appeared to be stable indicators of inflammation in patients with asthma, but did not appear to help predict high or low bronchodilator reversibility for patients with partly or poorly controlled asthma, according to study results.

Vitamin D Supplementation for the Prevention of Childhood Acute Respiratory Infections: A Systematic Review of Randomised Controlled Trials

Vitamin D supplementation may cut the risk of asthma exacerbation in children but it does not impact respiratory infections in healthy children, a review has found.

Women Seek More Treatment for Asthma Than Men

Study authors believe that altered perception of airflow obstruction, potential influences of female sex hormones, differences in bronchial hyper responsiveness, and health behaviors are all potential contributing factors to the gender differences.

Mothers' Diet During Pregnancy Linked to Childhood Asthma

A study of ten-year-old children whose mothers' diets lacked vitamin D and E during pregnancy appear more likely to develop asthma, and also suggests the underlying cause of asthma may be an effect present at birth in cells lining the airways.

Patients with Asthma Who Overuse Albuterol More Likely to Have Depression

The participants who overused albuterol had an increased odds of a lower quality of life, worse physical functioning and worse mental functioning, according to study results.

Researchers discovered that farm dust makes the mucous membrane inside the respiratory tract

react less severely to allergens such as house dust mite.
